

## at AMS headquarters

From 5 May through 16 May Executive Director Spengler was on active duty in the Air Force Reserve at Air Weather Service Headquarters, Scott AFB, Ill. On the 6th and 7th he was on temporary duty at Offutt AFB, headquarters of the Strategic Air Command, the 3rd Weather Wing, and the Global Weather Central. On the afternoon of the 7th he went to Ent AFB, Colo., for briefings at NORAD, Hq. Air Defense Command, and Hq. 4th Weather Wing, including the Solar Forecasting Facility, on 8-9 May. On the 9th he also visited the Air Force Academy and Lt. General Thomas S. Moorman, Jr., superintendent of the Academy and former commander of Air Weather Service.
