## DIRECTOR SCHOOL OF METEOROLOGY

The University of Oklahoma invites applications for Director of the School of Meteorology for the 1981 fall semester. The School offers B.S., M.S., and Ph.D. degrees in areas ranging from traditional atmospheric sciences to application-oriented climatology. These programs have developed close, synergistic relationships with the activities of the National Severe Storms Laboratory, the Oklahoma Climatological Survey, and the OU-NOAA Cooperative Institute for Mesoscale Meteorological Studies; and offer attractive opportunities for innovative multidisciplinary/multi-interinstitutional programs.

OU offers a comprehensive meteorology program comprising 120 undergraduates, 50 graduate students, 8 faculty members, and several research associates. The program has been highly productive as measured by its sponsored research activities and the success of its graduates. The Director is expected to provide leadership that will sustain and improve the quality and character of the overall program as well as to contribute to the teaching and research programs of the School. Applicants should have a Ph.D. in meteorology or an allied field and several years of relevant experience or equivalent qualifications.

Applications should include a resume, a list of publications, and names of at least 3 professional references. Candidates are encouraged to submit assessments of their professional goals and their impressions of the directions and goals for atmospheric sciences in the 1980's.
