OUTLINE OF PHILADELPHIA MEETING

On Thursday, December 30, there will be a symposium on Greenland, jointly with the Association of American Geographers, and there will be such climatological papers as the program affords. Some papers on fire weather also will be presented at the meeting of the Society of American Foresters, Thursday morning.

Friday morning, December 31, Professor Marvin will give his presidential address. General papers will follow, occupying the rest of the morning and such part of the afternoon as may be needed. The annual business meeting of the Society will close the afternoon session. Whether or not there will be sessions on Saturday, January 1, will be determined later when the program is made up.

The detailed program of the meeting with final announcements will be published in the December BULLETIN about December 1. Any member who wishes to present a paper at this meeting, and who has not yet notified the Secretary or the Editor, should do so at once. Brief abstracts of all papers, in a form suitable for publication, should be in the hands of the Secretary or Editor by December 1.
