

## EDITORIAL

For the better part of the last five years Drs. Christopher N. K. Mooers (April 1991–December 1995) and Dennis Wilson Moore (January 1992–June 1995) have given freely of their time and energy to serve as dedicated Editors of this journal. While continuing with submissions received until completion, they are now not accepting new submissions, and two new people have stepped forward to carry on their editorial work. Thus, I welcome as Editors Dr. Julian P. McCreary (July 1995) of Nova Southeastern University and Dr. Greg Holloway (January 1996) of the (Canadian) Institute of Ocean Sciences.

New manuscripts may be submitted to any of the present three editors, but their review will be facilitated if papers are submitted directly as follows: Papers primarily related to midlatitude and high-latitude oceanography to Dr. Holloway; coastal and tropical oceanography to Dr. McCreary; and small-scale physics of the ocean, air–sea interaction, and satellite oceanography to yours truly. Editorial policy as described in previous editorials (e.g., January 1992) remains unchanged, and each of the editors will be independently responsible for conducting the reviews of submissions received.

With this issue, the American Meteorological Society begins its 26th year of publication of the *Journal of Physical Oceanography*, an event marked by the symposium, A Salute to *JPO*, at the 1996 Annual Convention of the Society in Atlanta, Georgia (28 January to 1 February).
